Feb. 8th.Copy of Inspector's Report
1893

"Gratifying indications of kindly interest on the part of the Managers abound here. Marked improvement is shown in the Singing and Recitation, and some other points again call for praise, but on the whole, had it not been for allowance for the closing of the schools, the highest grants for Discipline and History could scarcely have been recommended, nor could the infants have been classified as good without hesitation. Needlework is fairly good. On the whole, results are not yet what these teachers can make them"
