Mixed School with Infants' Division: -

Since the last report was sent in 1911, one teacher has left the school. That report still describes the "mixed" division for the most part.

The children are orderly and attentive, and gather much from association with their Head Mistress. Thoroughness and alertness in the more commonplace details of the attainments would increase the efficiency. In other respects the training is sound and salutary.

Some very satisfactory written work in History and Geography was shown.
