Sent by Mr. Jye, Physical Training Organiser.

It is obvious that there has been much improvement in the Physical Training of this School during recent months. The Head Mistress' influence has already improved the discipline; this is indicated in the general tone & response of the children. Mrs. Davis, who undertakes the actual teaching of Physical Exercises, has recently attended a local Teachers' Class, from which she has obviously obtained much benefit. It is anticipated that this School will now improve rapidly, & they deserve encouragement from the Managers in the way of better facilities for their activities.

The play-ground is dusty & often unsuitable for free movement. Also it is essential that this School should have a small Playing Field for Organised Games.
