Summary of the Inspectors Report on the School
examined by him on July 12. 1872.

Rev^d. H. Kingston & his As^t. Teacher

" The Elementary instruction & the order are creditable to the Mistress, & the average attendance has improved most satisfactorily. There is not however sufficient cubical space for the increased numbers in the main room. The area of the Principal room & the Clap Room together is sufficient for a larger increase. Maps as well as more Books, Slates & Pictures for the Infant Room are wanted. (Artic. 32. b.)

The requirements of Article 17(c) must be strictly satisfied next year, or the Grant may be endangered.

Nov 18th It being so dark in the afternoon school
now opened 1.30 when the 1st bell
is to be rung. The 2nd bell to be rung
at a quarter to 2, every child then to be
in his/her place. Registers marked &
closed exactly at 2 o'clock. School
dismissed at 4 o'clock -
