Received notice that Margaret A. Crinkshaw was accepted as a Pupil Teacher. Art: 32. c.

"The instruction in this school has suffered on account of sickness in the Parish. The school is in very good order. Reading requires much attention; it is spidery & only barely passable. The Infants must receive more instruction from the Mistress.

The Accounts should in future be made up to the end of the School year. My Lords will be glad to see next year besides the Statement on Form IX for the year ending June 30, 1875 a supplementary Statement embracing the period from 1st January to June 30, 1874.
