dissatisfaction with the manner in
which the monitors Ellen Locke and Jane

past year. E. Locke has only attended 14 2/3

days, Jane Buckles 109 1/2 days. Now, with the vaccination before us, in the last month Ellen Locke has attended but one week. J. Buckles 1 wk + 3 days.

They also invariably enter the schoolroom in the morning after Prayers after school work has begun. This is in marked contrast to the punctuality & regularity both of the P. T. and the children. I cannot help adding that the P. T. has especially pleased me with punctuality during the whole year, never being late once during that time but always ready to meet the children as they assembled.

I cannot also add one word of praise to the children, who, although many of them have a long distance to come, are invariably at school by 9 o'clock.
