BELL RINGING AROUND CAMPSEA ASHE

Campsea Ashe is ideally suited for starting bell ringing tours and for visiting ringers wanting to ring at a variety of towers. The Church has easy access for motorists, being siutuated just off the A12 a few miles north of Woodbridge and with a large car park, and for cyclists and walkers the Wickham Market railway station on the East Coast line is just a few hundred yards away. Trains run each way approximately every two hours.


The bells at Campsea Ashe were restored and augmented in 2010 and the bells can now be rung from the new ringing galllery and community room. The peal of six bells incorporate three new bells, the treble (3 cwt), second (3cwt 14 lb) and third (3cwt 2qr), as well as three of the four bells that were already in the tower, the fourth (3 cwt 2 qr), fifth (4 cwt 3 qr) and tenor (6 cwt). The Church itself dates back to the 14th century and a Local Heritage Group is identifying local resources that will be of interest to many visitors who wish to know more about the heritage of the village and which will be available in the Church.

There are many other towers where bells can be rung within a 4 mile radius of Campsea Ashe and all the beautiful Churches are well worth a visit in their own right. This leaflet indicates the location of these towers and gives a little information about the bells. Further information, including contact details and practice times are available on the Suffolk Guild of Ringers website - www.suffolkbells.org.uk.
