

Walter Gorin

He was born on 18th February 1910 in Gloucester, the third child of Cornelius and Clara Gorin. His father was a Corn Merchants Clerk according to the 1911 census. He had an elder sister, Clara Phyllis and a brother, Charles. Sadly Clara died in 1915 when she was just nine years old.

He was ordained as Deacon in 1941 and Priest in 1943. He became a Chaplain in the Royal Navy and served on various ships, from at least 1944 to 1954. One ship he served on was HMS Vigilant and according to Wikipedia:

On March 26, 1945 she, along with the destroyers Saumarez, Volage, and Virago, intercepted a Japanese supply convoy east of Khota Andaman, Andaman Islands in the Indian Ocean. She and Virago sank CH-63. She participated in the Battle of the Malacca Strait with the destroyers Saumarez, Verulam, Venus, and Virago which culminated in the sinking of the Japanese cruiser Haguro on 16 May 1945.



In 1946 he married Freda Elizabeth Basson (1914 – 1998) and it is believed that they had three children.

He was appointed Rector of Campsea Ashe in 1957 and then moved to Gt. & Lt. Saxham with Westley from 1969-1979. He retired in 1979 and lived in Bury St Edmunds. He died in January 2009.
